



FISCAL SPONSORSHIP POLICY

Fiscal sponsorship is a formal arrangement in which a 501(c)(3) public charity sponsors a project that may lack exempt status. This alternative to starting your own nonprofit allows you to seek grants and solicit tax-deductible donations under your sponsor's exempt status.

The AABC Foundation may serve as a fiscal sponsor for projects that help to fulfill the mission of the Foundation to support the advancement of the AABC birth center model as the standard to improve maternity and women's health care. All projects must be submitted to the Foundation at least 4 – 6 weeks prior to their targeted initiation date and are subject to the approval of the Foundation's Board of Trustees.

Project funds will be invested according to the Foundation's investment policy. The Foundation will receive 4% of all monies including any interest received by the AABC Foundation for the project. It is the responsibility of the project coordinator to seek and secure any and all funding sources for the outlined project.

The project coordinator will report to the Foundation Board twice a year.

Proposals submitted for consideration shall include:

- Name and contact information of primary contact
- Name of project
- Description of Project including estimated duration
- Estimations of cost
- Possible Funding sources
- Biographical information of key stakeholders
